

PRIMARY BENEFITS OF REGISTRATION

There are a large number of benefits and support services that tennis venues can access through their British Tennis Registration, but most venues will cite one of the following as the most important reasons for registering:

- Venue Insurance
- British Tennis Membership
- British Tennis Member Wimbledon Ballot
- ClubSpark

This next section covers these primary benefits in more detail explaining the services that venues can access as part of their registration.



INSURANCE



What

As part of Venue Registration we provide venues with a comprehensive insurance package at no additional cost.

Combined Liability (Public Liability and Professional Indemnity) Insurance

- £50m limit of indemnity
- Includes competitions, fundraising and social activities
- Includes "multi-sports" cover

Employer's Liability Insurance

- £10m limit of indemnity
- Includes cover for volunteers

Director's and Officer's Liability Insurance Cover

- £1m limit of indemnity

In addition we also provide an online risk assessment programme to aid venues in the management of risk at their venue. As part of our insurance scheme we have also negotiated discounted rates on the following two products:

- A bespoke tennis venue property insurance scheme
 Court Cover
- 2. Electrical inspection programme to cover PAT testing

How

To access the insurance cover above, your venue needs to be a British Tennis Registered Venue and this is completed through the LTA website. Once you have completed the online Venue Registration, your insurance certificate will be automatically available in the Important Documents page of your admin area of the LTA website.

- If you are a newly registered venue, then your insurance will be valid from the date upon which you complete Registration (i.e. if you complete Registration on 20th December 2018, your insurance cover will begin on that date).
- If your venue was registered in 2017/18, then we provide temporary insurance cover between the period 1st October 30th November 2018 until you find time to complete your registration (i.e. if you were a registered venue in 2017/18 and you complete Registration on 15th November 2018, then your insurance cover will be backdated so that you are also covered between the period of 1st October 14th November 2018). However, if a claim is made in relation to your venue and a date in that period, your insurance will only be valid if you complete registration by the 30th November 2018 deadline.
- If your venue is not registered by the 30th November 2018 deadline, then insurance cover will have effectively lapsed on 30th September 2018 (the end of the 2017/18 year), leaving you liable for any claims made from 1st October 2018 onwards.
- If you complete Registration for 2018/18 anytime after the 30th November 2018 deadline (i.e. any date between 1st December 2018 and September 2019), then your insurance cover will NOT be backdated to 1st October, but will instead only be valid from the date on which you complete Registration. This applies even if you have been a registered venue in 2017/18.

We ask that you complete the risk assessment tool before registering your club each year; but it is also available all year round. The online risk assessment tool can be accessed here:

BRITISH TENNIS MEMBERSHIP

What

British Tennis Membership is the LTA's benefits scheme for individual players and fans.

There are three tiers available:

- British Tennis Lite Membership
- British Tennis Team Membership
- Child Membership

British Tennis Lite Membership is an exclusive free tier available for Juniors (11-17) and Adults (18 plus) who belong to our network of registered venues. Benefits include a British Tennis Rating and access to the annual British Tennis Wimbledon Ballot.

British Tennis Team Membership is the full benefits tier that costs just £10 for juniors and £20 for adults. Lite benefits are included plus priority ticket access for Major Events and Davis Cup, #ACE Magazine, 50% discounted Nitto ATP Finals tickets, and offers at the British Tennis Shop.

Child Membership for 4-10 years is free and in return for registering, members receive a Mini-Tennis rating so they can start competing plus access to offers at the British Tennis Shop

When

After a venue completes their registration, all British Tennis Lite Members linked to that venue will have their membership automatically renewed for another year. Those that have upgraded to Team Membership will need to individually renew and pay for their upgrade annually when required. If they decide not to renew to Team, they will automatically be moved onto Lite Membership, provided they are still linked to at least one LTA Registered Venue.

How

When a new member joins your venue, if they wish to join British Tennis they can do so direct by visiting **www.lta.org.uk/join**

When signing up the individual will first be asked to select either Child, Lite or Team Membership and then will be asked to select the primary venue that they belong to.

Current Lite Members wanting to upgrade to Team Membership should log in to their Members Area and simply click upgrade.

What

By being a registered venue you will be eligible to receive an allocation of Wimbledon tickets, for you to ballot to the British Tennis Members associated to your venue.

When

Access to your venues Wimbledon ticket allocation will be made available to your Ballot Administrator online via the LTA website in early March. Your venue will have until the end of May to complete the ballot for your eliqible opted in members.

How

To ensure your venue is eligible to access the ballot, you need to have completed the British Tennis venue registration by the deadline, which for 2018/19 is **30th November 2018** and paid your registration fees by your county association's payment deadline (dependent on your county).

If both of these requirements are met, you will receive an allocation of tickets based on the number of opted in British Tennis Members you have as of the 22nd February 2019. Please note, in order for your members to count towards your ticket allocation and enter your venues ballot, they must be a British Tennis Lite or Team Member, linked to your venue and have have opted in by the deadline. Any new members joining your venue after the 22nd February 2019 will not be valid for the 2019 ballot process but will be able to access the ballot the following year, if they are still a registered member of your venue.







GRANT FINDER

What

There are thousands of small, medium and large grant schemes operating throughout the UK. It is often very time consuming to find the right scheme for your project so to speed up the process we provide an online search engine. This free to use tool allows you to search through thousands of grant schemes available to help support both capital and revenue projects.

You will be asked some basic questions about your venue and provided a list of the schemes that you might be eligible for. Funding schemes change on a regular basis so we update the information in the tool on a daily basis.

COUNTY FUNDING GRANTS

What

Many County Tennis Associations operate small funding grants and loan schemes that registered tennis venues in the local area are able to apply for.

These funding schemes differ from county to county and so speak to your County Tennis Association to find out if they provide any funding support along with the details. If your club is Welsh or Scottish it is worth speaking to Tennis Wales or Tennis Scotland to find out if there are any local funding schemes that they would encourage you to apply for.



GREAT BRITISH TENNIS WEEKEND

What

Great British Tennis Weekend is a nationally promoted, locally delivered campaign, through which venues open their doors for people to play tennis for free. The primary objective is to provide trial opportunities for new players with the view to attracting and recruiting them to continuing playing at the venue on a regular basis.

We typically promote a number of nationally supported weekends and encourage you to run events on these dates so that you can benefit from the national marketing and promotion that happens ahead of each one.

Along with our national marketing support we provide free promotional materials, resources and prize packs to help you run a great event. We also provide an organisers guide and an online marketing toolkit where you can design bespoke marketing materials to help promote your event in the local community.

In 2018 over 1,000 venues ran one or more GBTW events, with over 50,000 people enjoying free tennis and 45% of those attending signing up to join their local tennis venue.

Tennis for kids

What

Tennis For Kids helps encourage more children across the nation to take up tennis. In 2018 over 1000 LTA Accredited coaches ran TFK courses at over 900 registered venues to thousands of new children. Since the programme launched in spring 2016 over 55,000 young people who are new to tennis have started to play.

Tennis For Kids is a six week coaching programme designed for 4-10 year olds. Courses are delivered by trained coaches across the country. The LTA provides high quality training and support to TFK coaches delivered by mentors including Leon Smith, Annabel Croft, Naomi Cavaday and Alfie Hewett. This ensures coaches are equipped to deliver inspiring sessions to all these new children trying tennis for the first time.

Every child that books on to a TFK course receives 6 coaching sessions, a Babolat racket (with 3 balls) and a personalised t-shirt – all for just £25.

The coaching sessions are targeted at beginners and coaches are encouraged to get parents on court too. Every course should have a follow on offer to encourage children (and their families) to continue playing. Many venues have recruited new family memberships through running TFK courses.

When

In 2018 the LTA introduced some improvements to TFK to ensure the programme evolves and continues to grow. One of these is that coaches can now run as many courses as they like at any point throughout the year to help grow their programme / venue membership.

TEAM CHALLENGE



What

Team Challenge provides an opportunity for players at venues up and down the country to play in one day, team competitions aimed at recreational mini & junior players in club programmes who are currently playing very little or no external competition. Over 12,000 young players took part in Team Challenge competitions across the country in 2018.

Over 200 cluster organisers are in place and this number is growing as more areas are confirmed to run the Team Challenge. Each cluster organiser is expected to contact approx. 3-6 local venues within less than 30 minutes of each other to organise a 2 to 3 hour team competition.

Matches do not count for ratings or rankings with the emphasis being on playing for a team in a local, fun competition. Cluster organisers can run events for Girls, Boys or Mixed teams with the focus being on mini and junior players.

Once a cluster organiser confirms an event time & date, they will be able to receive a free organiser pack which contains a number of resources, and promotional items including certificates and medals to help deliver each event. Events can use the red, orange, green or traditional yellow ball based on the ability and stage of the players that will be involved. Cluster organisers are encouraged to charge a small entry fee per player or per team to recognise the organiser(s) time. For example, each player taking part pays £5 to the organiser on arrival.

When

Team Challenge competitions can take place any time across the year. Cluster Organisers are asked to avoid key local clashes when scheduling events (e.g. Local leagues, Team Tennis dates etc.). An indoor grant of up to £100 is available for indoor venues who host an event between 1 November and 28 February.

What

Road to Wimbledon is the biggest junior singles tournament in British tennis and gives all 14U players the opportunity to progress through to compete on the world famous grass courts at Wimbledon.

Local clubs and parks are encouraged to stage a fun event for their U14 members that have an LTA Rating of between 10.2 and 7.1. For stronger rated players (6.2 or higher), there is the Road to Wimbledon International event, which players can enter directly.





When

We open for registration in December/January each year and venues organise their event between April and mid-June. Qualifying players have the opportunity to progress to County finals and ultimately the All England Club for the National Finals in August.

QUORN FAMILY TENNIS CUP

What

The Quorn Family Tennis Cup provides families with the opportunity to play tennis in an informal, fun competition run by their local club. There are two events:

- 1. Red Ball Event an opportunity for tennis venues to run a competition using the Mini Tennis red ball during February, March or April. In this event a child aged 10&U plays doubles with an adult family member. Winning pairs from each venue are invited to attend a festival day linked to an LTA grass court event in May or June.
- 2. Yellow Ball Event during September we run a number of regional tournaments where juniors aged 11-18 can play doubles on a full court with an adult family member. Successful pairs qualify for the National Finals in October.

TEAM TENNIS

What

Team Tennis is a singles and doubles team competition for LTA Registered venues. It aims to provide players of all ages (8&U – Open) with regular league matches, against similar standard players in a fun competitive team environment.

Fixtures consist of four singles and two doubles rubbers in most events. Approximately 10,000 fixtures take place each season across Great Britain involving 6,000 teams and over 26,000 players. Each league has a dedicated organiser who is the point of contact for each team captain throughout the competition.

When

Team Tennis takes place from the opening weekend in April through to July.

- Entry Period: **December and January**
- Draws & Fixtures Released: February
- Organisation of Fixtures: March
- League Season: April to July

COUNTY LEAGUES & COMPETITIONS

What

County leagues and competitions are at the heart of British Tennis - we estimate over 100,000 people participate. Your local County Association works extremely hard organising fixtures, publishing results and supporting team captains.

As a registered venue we would encourage you to take advantage of these fantastic competitions to provide your members with fun, local, team based competition.

When

It is likely that there are many different types of local leagues running in your County at different times of the year. In many Counties there will be a summer and winter league, as well as a variety of formats e.g. Men's Doubles or Mixed Doubles.

RESULTS MANAGER

What

Results Manager is a software tool that allows Competition Organisers to record and publish Grade 7 or ungraded competitions and submit results directly onto the LTA's database. Grade 7 competitions are usually internal events for members and those who play in squads at your venue.

The tool provides you with a quick and easy process to set up events and automatically send results to the LTA.

What

The ClubSpark LTA Competitions App has been created for Competition Organisers who want a simple way to run competitions. The app can be used for all recreational competitions including British Tennis Festivals, Club Championships, Road to Wimbledon Club Challenge, box leagues, competition in your coaching programme and much more.

The app allows users to create competitions, lookup registered British Tennis Members to add to events and create draws with the following draw formats – round robin, compass, matchplay and elimination from their Android or iOS device.

You can share the draw sheets and if required submit results directly to our database for British Tennis Ratings purposes.

TENNIS TOURNAMENT PLANNER

What

Tennis Tournament Planner (TTP) is a competition planning and management tool which can be used, free of charge, by LTA Registered Venues and tournament organisers to administer Grade 1-6 competitions.

TTP provides a step by step approach to running tournaments, including multiple draw types, access to the British Tennis Membership database and a website where results can be published. If you use TTP your tournament can also be added to the LTA website so players can find, enter and pay for your competitions online.

How

To use TTP you will need to:

- Have a valid DBS
- Have completed a Data Protection Agreement form
- Apply for a free licence (licences last a calendar year and will be renewed each January)

BUSINESS & LEGAL ADVICE

What

As a registered venue you have access to a free specialist business and legal advice telephone helpline called the **BASeline Business Advice Service**. BASeline can provide valuable guidance and advice to help venues on an assortment of different business-related topics that affect tennis venues, from taxation queries, financial management subjects, legal concerns, HR issues amongst many other business and legal concerns that arise when running a venue.

CLUB AND COACH FORUMS

What

The LTA in conjunction with County Tennis Associations run local forums each year that registered venues can attend to find out more information and ideas to support the development and running of your venue. These are good opportunities to discuss problems and issues affecting your club with both LTA officers and other local tennis venues, as well as picking up new ideas that could benefit your venue.

The LTA runs two types of forums:

- **1. Club Forums:** these are aimed at committee members and managers of the tennis venue and are focussed on the business, operations and development of your club.
- **2. Coach Forums:** these are aimed at supporting coaches, providing information and support to help coaches develop their coaching programme.

How

Both Club and Coach Forums are usually held in the autumn period, but contact your local LTA Regional **Team** to find out when forums are planned to be held in your area.



BRITISH TENNIS AWARDS

What

The British Tennis Awards provides you with an excellent way of thanking volunteers and coaches at your venue by nominating them for an award. You can also nominate the venue itself, with a £5,000 facilities grant awarded to the national winner. There are a total of 10 categories, recognising the truly outstanding efforts that so many unsung heroes contribute towards developing tennis in their local communities.

Winners are judged and awarded prizes at a County, Regional and National level and being nominated can mean a huge amount. County winners receive a certificate and voucher prize whilst Regional winners receive tickets to Major Events and an on-court trophy presentation. National finalists are treated to an exciting awards ceremony at Wimbledon and given Centre Court tickets.
